The Small Business Technology Council (SBTC) would like to express our strong support for Phil Johnson to lead the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO). We believe Mr. Johnson will bring a balanced, knowledgeable, and reasoned approach toward management of this vital government institution.

The SBTC is the high technology council of the National Small Business Association, the nation's longest running small-business advocacy organization. We're confident that Mr. Johnson will pursue a more focused solution that protects the needs of small businesses. This is consistent with the Administration's position to reform the patent system and support small business innovation.

This will be instrumental in advancing U.S. technological development. His endorsement from both large and small businesses demonstrates his broad industrial support.
